HISTORICAL MARKER RELOCATION


When a project requires the relocation of a historical marker, and the normal typical section does not provide for stopping at the marker (curb and gutter, no shoulder, etc.), a pull-off area is to be provided.

Relocation of the marker shall be coordinated with the District Environmental Division (Cultural Resources staff) and responsible District Traffic staff for review and coordination with the Department of Historic Resources (DHR).

The pull-off area is to be in accordance with the detail shown below.

The pavement design should be the same as the adjacent roadway. Applicable details (Insertable Sheet - <u>Historical Sign Marker Foundation</u>) for the post foundation should be included in the roadway plan assembly.

Relocation of the historical marker will be covered by Section 105.15 and 510.01 of the <u>Road and Bridge Specifications</u>. Measurement and Payment for removal, storage and reinstallation of historical markers per these Sections shall be determined by the designer as deemed appropriate for the specific requirements of the project.
